PL: I grew up in Southern California, Newport Beach and some other places. I didn't have the money to have a hot rod in high school. So it was only after I went in the Navy and got out and studied acting and became an actor and made a few bucks that I could get a hot rod or two, which I did.

#### FW: What happened to the car you drove in "American Graffiti"?

PL: That car was built for the movie by George Lucas, and Universal Pictures owned it.

#### FW: What's your favorite type of car?

PL: My favorite car, generally speaking, is Mustang. But I'd say for classic cars I prefer the '57 Chevy.

#### FW: Did you relate to the era portrayed in "American Graffiti"?

PL: That film depicted a world that was going out of existence by 1962 and '63, which was when I was surfing in Newport Beach, and learning acting in high school. So I missed the cruising era, although there were some car clubs in Newport Beach but I didn't have a car so I couldn't be a member.

#### FW: What did your parents do professionally when you were growing up?

PL: My stepfather was a nuclear physicist, and I had another stepfather who had been a boxer. And as a matter of fact I went into boxing briefly, and won an amateur boxing tournament — The Diamond Belt Tournament, in 1972 in Los Angeles.

#### FW: Do you still box as an amateur or just for fun?

PL: I work out at it, but I haven't hit anybody since the 1990s, or been hit.

PL: I'm also a writer. I write fiction. I have four books on Amazon Kindle. They're e-books. And I've been getting good responses from readers. As far as acting, I'm waiting for my agent, God bless him, to get me another job. ■
